This authorisation is given on the following terms and conditions:



EMERGENCY POWERS

Powers of a Hazard Management Officer

Section EM Act	Power <i>[where reasonably required for the purposes of emergency management]</i>
66	<p>Identifying particulars</p> <p>(3) Request a person to give the officer any or all of the person's personal details</p> <p>(4) If an officer reasonably suspects personal details supplied under a request [66(3)] are false, request the person to produce evidence of the correctness of the details</p>
67	<p>Movement and evacuation</p> <p>(a) Direct or, by direction, prohibit, the movement of persons, animals and vehicles within, into out of or around an emergency area or any part of an emergency area;</p> <p>(b) Direct the evacuation and removal of persons or animals from the emergency area or any part of any emergency area;</p> <p>(c) Close any road, access route or area of water in or leading to an emergency area</p> <p>(d) Direct that any road, access route or area of water in or leading to the emergency area be closed.</p>
68	<p>Use of vehicles</p> <p>Use a vehicle in any place and in any circumstances despite any provision of the <i>Road Traffic Act 1974</i> that requires a permit for the use of that vehicle or for the use of that vehicle in that place in that circumstance</p>
69	<p>Control or use of property</p> <p>(1) Take control of or make use of any place, vehicle or other thing;</p> <p>(2) The place, vehicle or other thing may be in, or outside, the emergency area</p>
70	<p>Direction of persons, or class of persons, exposed to hazardous substances <i>(maximum of 24 hrs)</i></p> <p>(1) (a) to remain in an area specified by the officer for such period as is specified by the officer;</p> <p>(b) to remain quarantined from other persons for such period, and in such reasonable manner, as is specified by the officer;</p> <p>(c) to submit to decontamination procedures within such reasonable period, and in such reasonable manner, as is specified by the officer.</p>
72	<p>Exchange of information</p> <p>(2) (a) disclose relevant information to:</p> <p>(i) an emergency management agency</p> <p>(ii) if the regulations so provide, to a person or entity engaged by an emergency management agency to provide welfare services in accordance with those regulations;</p> <p>(3) May request an emergency management agency that holds relevant information to disclose the information to the hazard management officer.</p>
76	<p>Use of force</p> <p>(1) If a person does not comply with a direction under this part, an officer may do all such things as are reasonably necessary to ensure compliance with the direction, using such force as is reasonable in the circumstances;</p> <p>(2) An officer may exercise a power under this part with the help, and using the force, that is reasonably necessary in the circumstances.</p>
77	<p>General Provisions</p> <p>(1) A direction may be given under this part orally or in writing,</p> <p>(2) A direction given orally is to be confirmed in writing within 2 working days after it is given, unless within that period it is complied with or cancelled.</p>

EMERGENCY POWERS

Powers of a Hazard Management Officer

Note: The following powers under s 72A of the *Emergency Management Act 2005* is only available before 4 July 2021

Section EM Act	Power <i>[where reasonably required for the purposes of emergency management]</i>
72A	General powers during an emergency situation (2) Take, or direct a person or class of person to take, any action that the officer considers is reasonably necessary to prevent, control or abate risks associated with the emergency. (3) Direct a person to (a) give to the officer relevant information about the person or any other person closely associated with the person; or (b) answer questions intended to elicit relevant information about the person or any other person closely associated with the person.
